

'Smart Cities' Conference

Monday Jan. 19th till Wednesday 21st 2009

Prince Khaled Al-Faisal, governor of Makkah region opened the international conference on intelligent cities. The conference was organized by the Makkah Municipality in cooperation with the Communications and Information Technology Commission (CITC) and the Makkah-based Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques Hajj Research Center.
